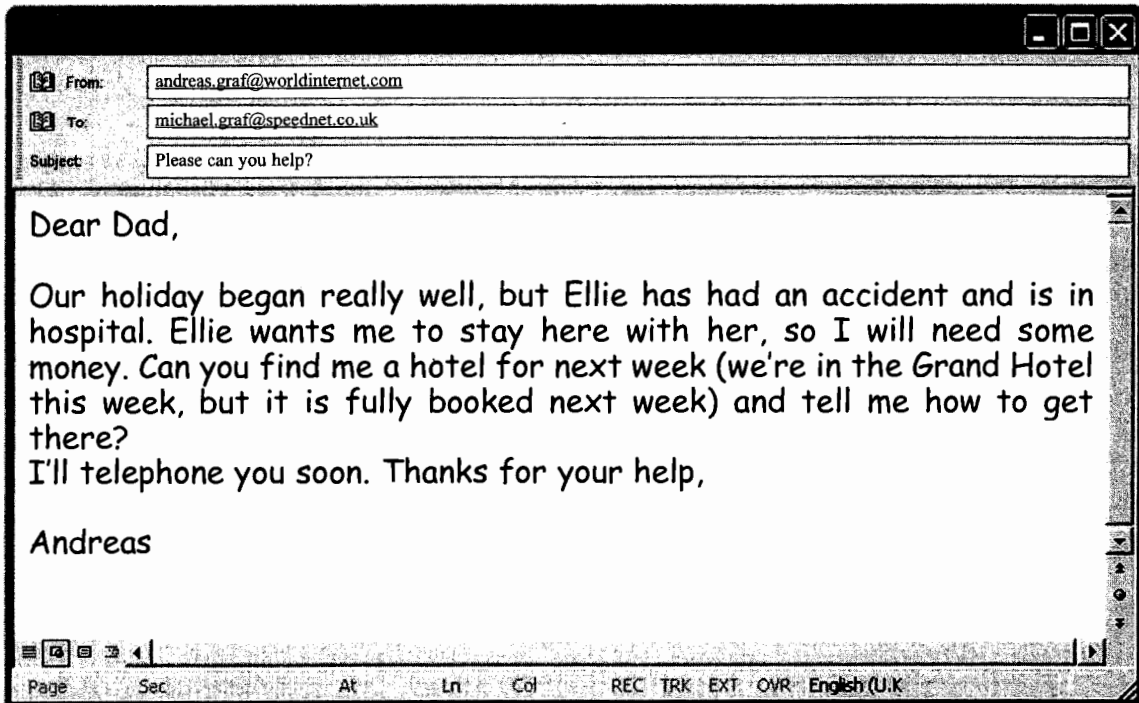

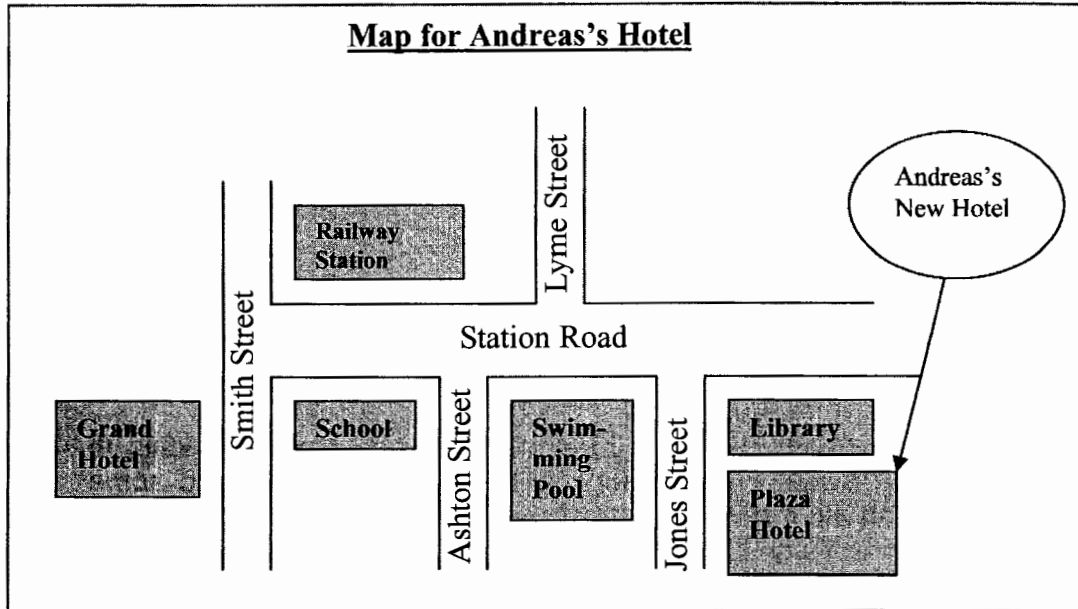

The Royal Flying Doctor Service of Australia

- 1.** This is the story of how medicine, air travel and radio combined to bring health care to people who live, work and travel in the more remote areas of Australia. Established in 1928 and developed on a national basis in the 1930s, the Flying Doctor Service provided emergency medical aid to the people of rural Australia and also a comprehensive health care and community service.
- 2.** Before the Flying Doctor Service began, a serious illness or an accident very often led to death, and Australia contains many graves of people who died because they couldn't get medical help. The Flying Doctor Service was an important medical organisation. To this day it remains unique, both for the range of health care and emergency services, and for the huge area that it covers – 24 hours a day, 365 days a year.
- 3.** The story of the Flying Doctor Service will always be linked with its founder, the Reverend John Flynn. It is a story of achievement that has given hope to many Australians. In 1911, the Reverend John Flynn took up his first job at Beltana Mission, in South Australia. He became very close to the local people, and developed such good relationships with them, that he accepted permanent work there one year later.
- 4.** He began his work at a time when only two doctors served an area of 1,800,000 square kilometres in Australia. Flynn began to establish basic hospitals in areas difficult to reach. However, while these were important, and did a lot to help people living in rural areas, they only began to improve health care for Australians. Distance and communication remained problems, and many Australians continued to die because of the lack of available medical care. Flynn told many stories to show the need for improved medical care in Australia.
- 5.** One of his stories was that of Jimmy Darcy, a farmer hurt in a fall near Halls Creek, Western Australia, in August 1917. Friends found Darcy badly injured after he fell from his horse, and they took him to the nearest town, Halls Creek which was 30 kilometres away, a 10-hour journey by horse. The post office manager there realised that Darcy's injuries were very serious, and he spent many hours trying to contact doctors in nearby towns by radio. He finally managed to contact Dr Holland, 2,500 kilometres away in Perth. Dr Holland gave the post office manager instructions over the radio, and he carried out two long and painful operations on Darcy. After the operation, Darcy went on a 10-day journey from Hall's Creek to Perth by boat. Sadly, even though the operations were successful, he died on the way as he had become so weak.
- 6.** Australian newspapers widely reported the tragedy of Jimmy Darcy and attracted nationwide attention to the urgent need for more doctors, nurses and hospitals in areas difficult to reach. In 1903, the first powered air flight had taken place, and by 1914, the aeroplane began to prove itself as a reliable means of transport. Radio also began to display its ability to link people thousands of miles apart. John Flynn combined these developments with his fundraising abilities, and by 1928, there was enough money to establish the Flying Doctor service.

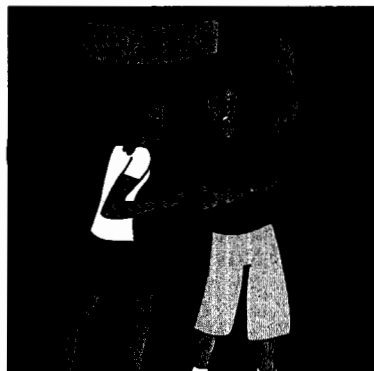
